BRIAN LAWTON EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER



Brian Lawton was named executive vice president and general manager of the Tampa Bay Lightning on October 22, 2008 after serving as vice president of hockey operations for less than four months. He was hired by owners Oren Koules and Len Barrie to rebuild the organization's hockey operations department with focuses on both the short and long term. He is responsible for all aspects of hockey operations, including the coaching and scouting staffs, player procurement and development, and minor league affiliations and operations.

Lawton spent the summer of 2009 quietly re-tooling Tampa Bay's roster through a series of calculated and well-planned moves that restructured the blue line, added firepower up front and improved the overall depth of the organization. First, Lawton secured things behind the bench, removing the interim tag from head coach Rick Tocchet, then adding defensive specialist and Stanley Cup champion Rick Wilson as associate coach later in the summer. He then went to work re-tooling the roster, beginning with the signing of one of the top available free agents in defenseman Mattias Ohlund. He was also able to add defensemen Matt Walker and Kurtis Foster in free agency as well as forwards Alex Tanguay, Stephane Veilleux and goaltender Antero Niittymaki.

Lawton was able to add a young franchise player with the second overall pick in the 2009 draft when the Lightning selected Swedish defenseman Victor Hedman. Hedman's selection came on the heels of the 2008 draft when Tampa Bay selected Steven Stamkos first overall. Stamkos went on to set the franchise record for most goals in a season by a rookie, with 23. The team's success under Lawton continued as he traded up to acquire a second pick in the first round for the first time in franchise history, selecting Carter Ashton. They were also able to select Slovakian Richard Panik, who was also high on the draft board, in the second round. Additionally, Lawton was able to build the organizational depth by acquiring Drew Miller, Todd Fedoruk and David Hale while still retaining the team's core of Vincent Lecavalier, Martin St. Louis, Paul Ranger, Ryan Malone, Andrej Meszaros and Mike Smith.

Before joining the Lightning in the summer of 2008, Lawton spent 14 years as a player agent, representing prominent NHLers such as Mike Modano, Mark Parrish and the current Lightning forward Jeff Halpern, to name a few. A native of New Jersey who grew up in Rhode Island, Lawton was drafted first overall by the Minnesota North Stars in 1983 and he skated in 483 NHL games over nine seasons for Minnesota, the New York Rangers, Hartford, Quebec, Boston and San Jose, recording 112 goals and 266 points with 401 penalty minutes. He also appeared in the Stanley Cup playoffs three times.

Having served four seasons as his team's player representative for the NHL Players Association, Lawton put that knowledge to use when he retired by becoming a player agent. He started his own firm, Lawton Sport and Financial, in 1994, and became a prominent agent, negotiating more than \$300 million in player contracts.

Named three times to *The Hockey News'* list of the "100 Most Powerful People in Hockey," Lawton eventually sold his business in 1998 to Octagon Athlete Representation, one of the United States' largest sports agencies. Based out of Minneapolis, Lawton became Managing Director of Octagon's Hockey Division. With Octagon, Lawton built the second largest hockey agency in the NHL, with clients that included Bret Hedican, Keith Carney, Ryan Miller, and Kari Lehtonen.

A graduate of Mount Saint Charles Academy in Woonsocket, Rhode Island, Lawton is noted for being the first United States - born hockey player chosen first overall in the NHL draft. He represented the U.S. on several occasions, including the 1982 World Junior Championships, the 1983 World Championships, the 1984 Canada Cup, the 1987 World Championships and the 1988 Canada Cup.

Brian and his wife, Angelina, reside in Tampa with their sons, Jack (13) and Nick (9), and daughter, Gabby (5).

TOM KURVERS ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER



Tom Kurvers enters his second season as Assistant General Manager after being named to the position on July 9, 2008. He is responsible for all personnel issues for the Lightning, including those in the minor leagues. Kurvers will assist Executive Vice President and General Manager Brian Lawton in all aspects of player evaluation and will have input on all player decisions. He will also serve as a scout on an as-needed basis.

Prior to joining the Lightning Kurvers served three seasons as director of player personnel for the Phoenix Coyotes. As director of player personnel he oversaw all aspects of the team's scouting, including both the Coyotes' amateur and pro scouting departments. He spent a total of 11 years with the Coyotes, including one as a radio analyst and seven as a professional scout. He also served as interim assistant coach for the final two months of the 2003-04 season.

Kurvers played in 11 NHL seasons from 1984-95, appearing in 659 regular season games, with 93 goals and 328 assists for 421 points. He also played in 58 NHL playoff games, recording eight goals and 30 points. He was a Stanley Cup Champion with the 1986 Montreal Canadiens.

Before joining the professional ranks Kurvers had an outstanding college career at the University of Minnesota – Duluth, setting numerous school records including: most career goals by a defenseman (43), most career assists (152) and assists by a defenseman (career - 149 and season - 58). In 1984, he was honored with the Hobey Baker Award, WCHA MVP and was named an All-American. He was named to the WCHA Top 50 of All Time Team, and has been inducted into both the UMD and Bloomington Jefferson High School Athletic Hall of Fames.

Kurvers received his under graduate Bachelor Arts degree in Communications from UMD in 1984. While an active NHL player he began graduate studies in 1991, completing courses in the off seasons through 1996. Highlighted in the curriculum was an accredited seminar sponsored by the world renowned Aspen Institute. Upon retirement in 1997, he earned his Masters of Business Administration Degree in sports management from the University of St. Thomas.

Tom, his wife Heather, daughters Madison, Rose, and sons Weston and Roman, reside in East Gull Lake, Minnesota.

RICK TOCCHET *HEAD COACH*



Rick Tocchet enters his first full season as head coach of the Lightning after taking over for Barry Melrose as interim head coach on November 16, 2008. He became the seventh head coach in franchise history after the interim tag was removed on May 11, 2009, signing a two-year deal.

Tocchet is a 24-year NHL veteran both as a player and a coach. He played 18 seasons with Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Los Angeles, Boston, Washington and Phoenix. During his career he amassed 1,144 career games and he recorded 440 goals, 952 points and 2,972 penalty minutes. He also appeared in 145 playoff games and netted 52 goals with 112 points and 471 penalty minutes.

The Scarborough, Ontario native won the Stanley Cup with the Pittsburgh Penguins in 1992 and appeared in the Stanley Cup Finals with Philadelphia in 1987. Tocchet also played under former Lightning head coach Barry Melrose with Los Angeles during the 1994-95 season. He was selected to four NHL All-Star teams (1989, 1990, 1991, 1993).

Tocchet is one of three players in the history of the NHL to record 400 goals or more and at least 2,500 penalty minutes. He was a 11-time 20-goal scorer, and a two-time 30-goal scorer. He also recorded three 40-goal campaigns. In 1992-93 he set career highs for goals with 48, assists with 61 and points with 109 in 80 games with the Penguins. Internationally, Tocchet represented Canada at the 1990 and 1991 World Championships as well as in the 1987 and 1991 Canada Cup Tournaments.

He was originally drafted by Philadelphia in the sixth-round, 125th overall, at the 1983 NHL Entry Draft. Tocchet began his career with the Flyers in 1984-85 and retired midway through the 2001-02 season, also with Philadelphia. Shortly after retiring he joined the Colorado Avalanche as an assist coach. He spent a season and a half on the bench with the Avalanche before joining former teammate Wayne Gretzky as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Coyotes in 2005.

RICK WILSON *ASSOCIATE COACH*

Rick Wilson enters his first season as a member of Rick Tocchet's staff as associate coach. A NHL coaching veteran with 20 years of experience behind the bench, Wilson's primary focus for the Lightning will be to coach the defense. He will be looked upon to groom and mentor the team's young defensive players, with a goal of molding them into a cohesive unit that can grow into an elite group in the NHL.

Wilson, a native of Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, spent the previous 16 seasons with the Dallas Stars, winning the Stanley Cup in 1999 working along side head coach Ken Hitchcock. During his tenure with the Stars, Wilson helped lead the team to seven division titles, two Western Conference championships and two President's Trophies. He had most recently served as associate coach for the previous six seasons, focusing on the team's defense and penalty kill. Under Wilson's guidance the Stars finished in the top three for fewest goals against in the NHL during the 2007-08, 2006-07, 2003-04 and 2002-03 seasons.

Before being named associate coach, Wilson held the position of assistant coach with the Stars for 10 seasons, joining the club for the 1992-93 campaign. He served as interim head coach for 32 games during the 2001-02 campaign, leading the Stars to a 13-11-7-1 record to close out the season.

Prior to joining Dallas, Wilson worked as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Kings for three seasons from 1989-92. With the Kings Wilson worked with Raeder, serving as co-coaches for 15 games in 1990-91. Wilson joined the Kings from the New York Islanders, where he served as an assistant coach for the 1988-89 season. He also served as an assistant for Canada's National Junior Team that year.

WES WALZ *ASSISTANT COACH*

Wes Walz enters his second season as assistant coach for the Lightning after ending his playing career in December of 2007.

Walz, a veteran of 13 seasons in the NHL, played in 607 career games with Boston, Philadelphia, Calgary, Detroit and Minnesota. He recorded 109 career goals, 260 points and 14 shorthanded goals. He was known as a defensive specialist, amassing a plus-23 rating for his career.

The Calgary, Alberta native made his mark with the Wild, where he played 438 of his 607 games and was a finalist for the Frank J. Selke Trophy as the NHL's best defensive forward in 2002-03. Walz was twice chosen by the Twin Cities chapter of the Professional Hockey Writers' Association as nominee for the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy, awarded annually to the player who best exemplifies the qualities of perseverance, sportsmanship, and dedication to hockey.

At the time of his retirement Walz ranked second all-time in games played for the Wild. He also served as Minnesota's captain for a portion of the season in 2000-01. Walz was second to last player from the Wild's inaugural season to leave the team, before Marian Gaborik joined the New York Rangers in the summer of 2009. He also scored the first playoff game-winning goal in Minnesota franchise history in 2003.

Walz and his wife, Kerry-Anne, live in Oldsmar with their son, Kelvin (17), and their daughters, Jaedyn (13), Brehna (9) and Cheyenne (2).

CAP RAEDER *GOALTENDING COACH*

Cap Raeder enters his second season as assistant coach with the Lightning. His focus is on the organization's goaltenders, both at the NHL level and in the system. He also assists in the scouting of goaltending prospects.

Raeder, a native of Needham, Massachusetts, spent 11 seasons in the San Jose Sharks organization before joining the Lightning. He served as a professional scout for nine years and also served as an assistant coach during the 2000-01 season. Before joining the Sharks, Raeder served an assistant coach at the NHL level for nine seasons with Boston and Los Angeles.

Before joining the Kings, Raeder was the head coach at Clarkson University. He coached in 86 games with the Golden Knights and posted a 50-30-6 record, including two appearances in the East Coast Athletic Conference Championship Game in 1986 and 1988. He also served as an assistant coach for two seasons before taking the head coach position at Clarkson. Raeder began his career with the University of New Hampshire where he spent two seasons as an assistant coach.
